Long History of Transit Planning & Service in Atlanta Region

Focus on system start-up & expansion

- **1950s** recognition of public transportation, including new rail system, importance to growth of region
- **1960s** focus on proposals for rapid transit systems
- 1970s legislative activity and voter referendum
- 1980s & 1990s rail & bus expansions beyond MARTA service area
- **2000s** further regional bus service expansions

Regional Transit Institutional Analysis (RTIA)

Direction is evolving and changing...

Who would build, operate and maintain a fixed guideway line from Cumberland to Doraville?

- Key Goal: Examine how Atlanta region currently organized to plan, built, fund and operate transit service and recommend strategies to provide more comprehensive, truly regional transit system
- Challenges
 - Limited service coordination
 - Separate fare and funding structures
 - General lack of funding from all levels of government




