# Presenter

**David Vautin, AICP** is a Principal Planner/Analyst at the Metropolitan Transportation Commission and the Association of Bay Area Governments (MTC/ABAG) in San Francisco, California, leading the agency's efforts in the fields of performance assessment and performance monitoring over the past eight years. He is the project manager for both Horizon, the region's new planning process to prepare for an uncertain future through "what if...?" scenario planning, and Vital Signs, an award-winning performance monitoring initiative which tracks a suite of regionwide metrics related to transportation, land use, economic development, environmental protection, and social equity. Previously, David was the agency lead on performance assessment for Plan Bay Area (2013) and Plan Bay Area 2040 (2017). His work on MTC/ABAG's innovative project performance assessment was particularly influential, establishing regional priorities for future New Starts and Small Starts funding opportunities and prompting policy discussions about cost-ineffective or sprawl-inducing projects. He received his Master of Science degree in Civil Engineering from the University of California, Berkeley and his Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering from Cornell University.



# Presentation – Bay Area Vital Signs

In an era of stagnant budgets, performance measurement has emerged as a crucial tool to demonstrate progress (or lack thereof) towards key planning goals. After the adoption of the San Francisco Bay Area's first integrated transportation and land use plan in 2013, regional stakeholders came together to develop a comprehensive performance monitoring program. With indicators cutting across the jurisdiction of all four regional planning agencies - the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC), the Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG), the Bay Area Air Quality Monitoring District (BAAQMD), and the Bay Conservation and Development Commission (BCDC) - this effort relied extensive collaboration to ensure a seamless result for the public. Instead of developing a lengthy paper report – as had been done in the past – Bay Area agencies took a different course, building an interactive website that allows any resident to explore data and even drill down to neighborhood-level performance. The result was Bay Area Vital Signs, a powerful web tool that combines performance monitoring with data visualization and data-driven journalism to communicate the regional “story”, while allowing Bay Area residents to dig and explore the detailed data in an interactive manner.
