

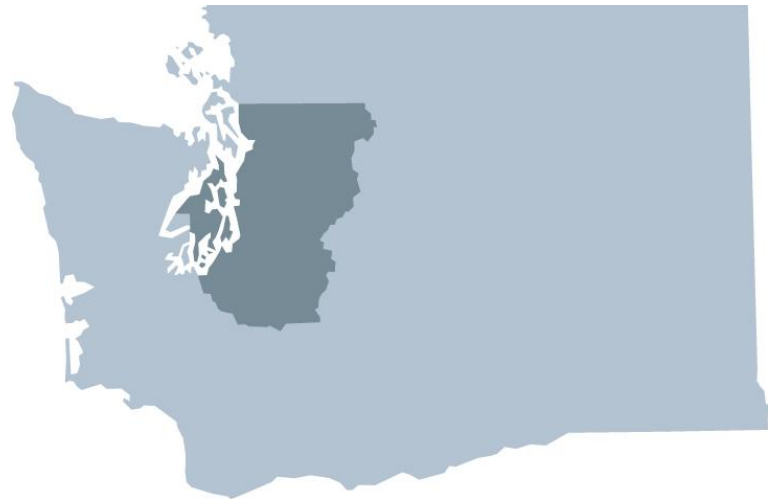

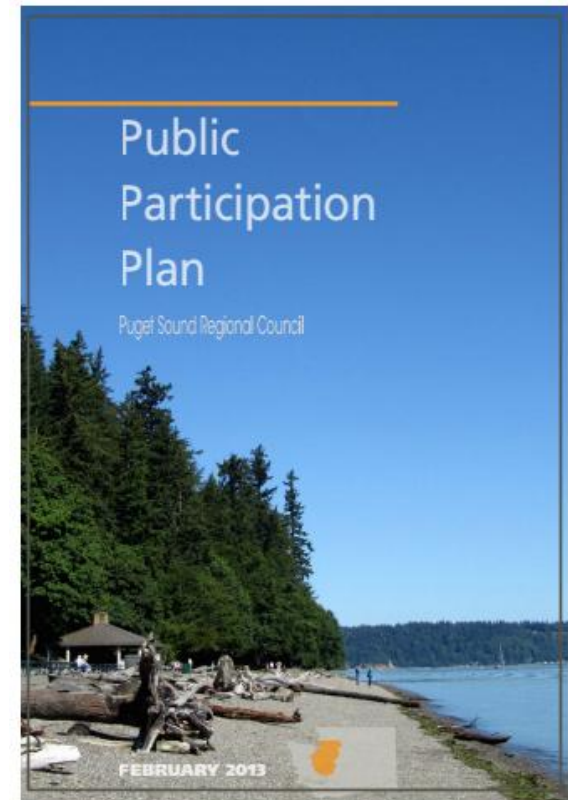

To watch live meeting footage, click on the words **In Progress**. 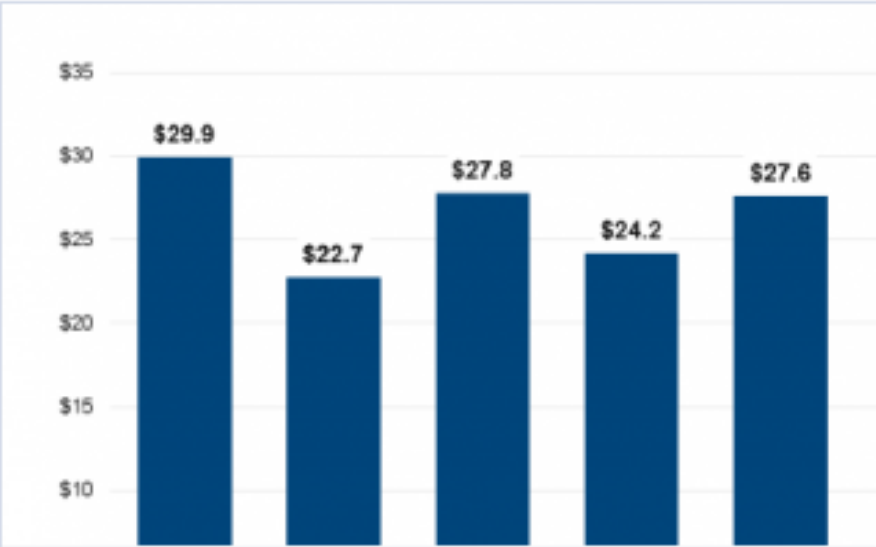
