Notable Practices

Several regions currently foster innovation and partnership among civilian and military organizations. These examples offer a wide array of strategies and lessons that may be applicable in other communities and should be of interest to both military and civilian audiences.

Hampton Roads Transportation Planning Organization (Virginia) maintains an active focus on military transportation needs of the many bases within this region, including a Military Commuter Survey and a Highway Network Analysis specific to military mobility needs. Planning for Livable Military Communities is a partnership of the North Central Texas Council of Governments and the defense communities around Naval Air Station Fort Worth, Joint Reserve Base.
